Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If you tell your boss, "I was here before you, so I don't see why I should have to ask your permission," you might be in trouble.

If you ask a woman when her due date is, and she isn't pregnant, you might be in trouble.

If your parents use your middle name when calling you, you might be in trouble.

If you pull over a cop and ask him how fast he was going, you might be in trouble.

If you ask your wife, "Have you gained some weight in your rear end?" you might be in trouble.

There are so many things we do that might get us into trouble. But if we start believing that we are better than other people because of what they have done, we *will be* in trouble.

I read an article the other day that was challenging not because it claimed anything new or radical, but because of how far it went. It was called *The Gospel According to Jeffrey Dahmer*. Dahmer, if you remember, was the guy from Milwaukee that killed 17 people through the 1980s and early 1990s, dismembered their bodies, and stored some of the pieces for later consumption. He was arrested, convicted, and sentenced to prison for the rest of his life.

As challenging as his story is, the next part is where it gets hard for Christians.

While Dahmer was in prison, he asked for a Bible. He also met Roy Ratcliff, pastor of a

local church. Ratcliff led Dahmer to Christ and eventually baptized him in the prison whirlpool. Dahmer, it seems, became a Christian! If this is true, then when we die and go to heaven, one of the people we meet there will be this horrifying mass murderer!

I don't know about you, but that kind of freaks me out a little. And this is why this type of thing gets us into real trouble. It is *really* easy to think that we are better than other people because of what they have done. It is really easy to forget what *grace* truly is. And it is really easy to forget that we need God's grace just as much as Dahmer did.

God's grace is arguably the most remarkable thing we will ever encounter. As the article mentioned earlier states, "Grace is incomprehensibly comforting yet incomparably devastating. Grace kills the human made economy of performance and merit." Jeffrey Dahmer, Mother Teresa, you, and I all carry the exact same amount of worthiness to Judgment Day – precisely zero. It goes against everything we know about life, against everything we feel about justice, and against everything we hope about ourselves. "Surely," we say to ourselves, "I am better than \_\_\_\_\_\_ is!"

There are so many ways for us to get into trouble in life. But it is when we try to argue our way into heaven based on our own merit that we get into real trouble. Take care that you don't focus on yourself, and don't take your eyes off what Christ did for you.




