Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Is Satan an idiot? Why in the world would he go all in against an omnipotent God? Why oppose Jesus at every turn?

While Jesus was on the earth, he and Satan had an extended conversation. We call it The Temptation of Jesus, and we can read an account of it in Matthew 4:1-11.

Jesus had been fasting for 40 days and 40 nights, and in one of the greatest understatements in human history, the Bible tells us that "he was hungry." No kidding. I would be too!

So Satan shows up and tells Jesus to make some bread out of the rocks lying around if he is the Son of God. This temptation is easy to identify with, certainly. We've all been at least a little hungry, staring into an empty refrigerator, wondering what to snack on!

But the next two attempts seem a little weird on the surface. Jesus goes to the top of the temple, and Satan suggests that he jump off. Not very tempting. Then they go to a mountaintop somewhere, and Satan says that if Jesus would worship him, he would give Jesus all the kingdoms of the world, along with all their splendor. Now think about this: if Jesus was truly present at the creation of the universe (he was) then all the money and power one measly planet could offer would seem insignificant! This is what always confused me: why would Jesus find the kingdoms of earth tempting if he was present at creation?

Well, it turns out that things aren't quite so simple, and Satan isn't the idiot we would like him to be. First of all the temptation about bread is not about bread or hunger. That's just what Satan was using. The real objective is revealed when Satan says "IF you are the Son of God." He's

trying to get Jesus to doubt his purpose on earth. He's trying to get Jesus to doubt his identity. He's proverbially whispering in Jesus' ear, 'Are you sure? Because it kinda seems like God abandoned you here.' The truly amazing thing is he still does that today! Satan still tries to get us to doubt our identity in Christ, get us to feel bitterness toward God, and to question if we are even called to do anything.

The second temptation wasn't as dumb as it seems either. It was no mistake that Satan suggested he jump from the temple, instead of any other building / convenient cliff around. The temple was where you were closest to God, and the top of the temple was where you were even closer. Satan was trying to get a human Jesus to doubt his relationship with God, to wonder if God really would protect him. Does he still do that today? Yep.

To understand the third one, ask yourself what Jesus would find tempting about being President For Life of every country on Earth. When I ask myself that question, I have to conclude that if Jesus were truly in control, as opposed to the Prince of the Earth (Satan), there would be no war. There would be no famine. No pandemics. No disease. No sickness. If Jesus had fallen for this, the Earth would be a much better place, yes, but that would have meant literally making a deal with the Devil, actually worshipping him. No dice.

Satan tempted Jesus, and you can bet he will come after you, too. That's no surprise. The surprise is that like Jesus, you too can resist and beat him! It's not that you are stronger or smarter than Satan, but that Christ gives us his Spirit. With God's help, we can stand firm!

Baking Supplies: cake and muffin mixes, frosting, oil, flour, sugar **Canned Goods**: fruit, vegetables, soup, condiments, meat substitutes

Cereal: hot cereal, cold cereal, cereal and breakfast bars **Cleaning Supplies**: laundry soap, dish soap, hand soap **Paper Goods**: toilet tissue, paper towels, napkins, facial tissue
