Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

December 25. Jesus' birthday. I have heard that some families buy presents not only for each other, but as a family give one to Jesus as well. Maybe a donation of some kind, or volunteering as a family; whatever the family decides. Whatever Jesus would like for his birthday!

But just when, exactly, was Jesus' birthday? December 25, in the year 0, right? Weeellll, probably not. First of all, I tricked you. There is no year 0. The calendar goes from 1BC to 1AD. But more to the point, the simple fact is there is nothing in the Bible that provides a whole lot of clarity to the timing of his birth. What we do have, however, is a bunch of shepherds with a bunch of sheep out in the middle of nowhere. Sheep grazing on grass would seem to lead us away from a midwinter date. So would the fact that a lot of roads in the area would be impassable around that time of year. A governor that required everyone to travel on these roads to be registered would be crazy.

So why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25? It probably started with Emperor Constantine, in the year 336AD. December 25 happened to be the date of the pagan feast of Saturnalia, and afforded Christians a couple of easy analogies.

First, Saturnalia celebrated the return of the sun. Even today, you have probably noticed that the days are getting shorter and shorter all the time. Saturnalia celebrated light coming into the world and driving back the darkness. Choosing this date, therefore, offered Christians a chance to teach non-Christians about the nature of Jesus, who illumines our dark world.

Second, people used to exchange gifts on Saturnalia. Gifts also play a large role in the narrative about Jesus. The Magi from the east brought Jesus gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And the very salvation that Jesus brings is also referred to as a gift (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Third, and perhaps most obvious, is that Saturn was thought to be king of the gods. What better way to declare the supremacy of Christ than to take over the holiday of 'the king?'

If Jesus wasn't born on December 25, then when was his birthday? It has been suggested that Jesus might really have been born around a couple other holidays. Jews normally travelled all over the place for the Passover, which is typically held in the springtime. This would be a natural time for a governor to want to require people to travel to a specific place to be counted. Also, people traveled a lot for the Feast of Tabernacles, which took place around September or October. This festival celebrated God's providence for the Israelites in the desert, and included families bringing tabernacles, or tents. This would be another natural time to require people to travel, but leaves the question "Then why did Mary have to stay in a stable?"

So as you celebrate Christmas this year, remember it for what it is – a historical event that really happened, where the King of Kings and Lord of Lords came to earth to bring light and the gift of salvation. Just don't get hung up on the date!


